A Message from the Executive Director

事務局長からのメッセージ

This year marks 50 years of Kimochi service and advocacy for Bay Area seniors and their caregivers. Although COVID prevents us from celebrating together, we share our pride for this milestone and pledge our commitment to the work ahead.

When Steve Nakajo and Sandy Mori, along with a group of dedicated Sansei, founded Kimochi in 1971, little did they envision that Kimochi would grow to become a nationally recognized, community-based organization.

What began as their simple commitment to provide for the care and well-being of the aging Issei generation, today, provides more than 133,000 Japanese-style take-out and home-delivered meals to seniors annually – with the need only continuing to grow. Social services and transportation programs continue to operate with some modifications due to COVID restrictions. Exercise and social activities will continue online until it is safe for seniors to gather again.

Kimochi also operates two assisted living facilities. Kimochi Home opened its doors in Japantown in 1983 and is home to 19 ambulatory residents. In 2016, Kimochi San Mateo became home to 14 ambulatory and non-ambulatory seniors – it is also a Peninsula base for weekday, Japanese-style, home-delivered meals.

All this could not have been done without the heartfelt, generous support of so many families, donors, volunteers -- and staff who continue to build upon the enduring principle of providing the highest level of quality care, in the Japanese tradition of respect for our elders, to seniors of all ethnicities. It is with this same commitment, Kimochi opens its arms to future generations of seniors. And we thank you, with deep gratitude, for your kimochi today and every day.

今年気持会では、ベイエリアの高齢者とその介護者への奉仕と擁護を始めて50年を迎えます。コロナ禍のため皆さんと一緒に祝うことはできませんが、私たちは、この節目の年において私たちの誇りである功績を皆さんと共有し、今後の活動へのコミットメントを誓います。

スティーブ・ナカジョウとサンディ・モリが献身的な日系3世のグループとともに、1971年に気持会を設立した時、気持会が全国的に認められたコミュニティベースの組織になるとはまるで想像していませんでした。

高齢の一世世代のケアと福祉を提供するという彼らの単純明快なコミットメントとして始まったものは、今日、年間133,000食以上の日本食のテイクアウトと宅配の食事を高齢者に提供しています。そしてそのニーズは、増え続けています。ソーシャルサービス(社会福祉)及び送迎プログラムは、コロナ禍の制限により、いくつかの変更を加え、引き続き運営されています。運動と社会活動(ソーシャルアクティビティ)は、高齢者が再び集まって行動することが安全になるまで、オンラインで継続されます。

気持会ではまた、2か所の介護施設の運営を行っております。気持ホームは、1983年にジャパントウンにオープンし、19人の歩行可能な高齢者が居住しています。2016年、14人の歩行者と歩行不可能な高齢者の居住施設としてオープンした気持サンマテオは、ペニンシュラ地区の日本食宅配の拠点にもなっています。

これはすべて、多くの家族、寄付者、ボランティアの皆さん、そして気持会スタッフの日本の文化背景を尊重した伝統的で最高レベルの質の高いケアをすべてのエスニックバックグラウンドを持つ高齢者に提供するという永続的な原則に基づいて構築し続けるスタッフの、心からの寛大なサポートなしには成し遂げられなかったでしょう。これと同じように、気持会では、次世代に高齢者となる皆さんにも手を差し伸べることを誓います。そして皆さんの気持ちに、今日もこれからも、日々心より感謝致します。

In 2030, just nine short years away, all baby boomers will be older than age 65. This expansion of our senior population means there will be a growing number of adults who, despite their desire to live

independently, may need to rely on the help of others. Kimochi is committed to being there to care and advocate for future generations of seniors -- and their caregivers.

Over the past 50 years, Kimochi has provided services that help seniors live with dignity and independence, delaying or avoiding the need for institutionalization. This includes meals programs, transportation and social services, home care referrals, adult day activities and assisted living support.

To keep these services in place and evolve as new generations need help, Kimochi is asking your help in building the "Kimochi Dedication Wall." Our goal is to raise \$500,000 from individual and corporate gifts by September 1, 2022 with all monies dedicated to directly benefit and develop senior programs and caregiver support.

"It is through support of families, friends, donors and volunteers, like you, that Kimochi has continued to thrive," say Sandy Mori and Steve Nakajo, Kimochi co-founders. "This Dedication Wall demonstrates our commitment as a community -- like we have since 1971 -- that Kimochi is a part of our intergenerational fabric and necessary network of care for seniors and their family of caregivers.

To date, Kimochi has already received pledges of \$47,000 to the Dedication Wall. わずか9年後の2030年には、全ての団塊の世代が65歳以上になります。この高齢者人口の増加は、高齢者であっても自立していたいという願望があるにもかかわらず、他者の助けに頼らなければならない高齢者の数が増えることを意味しています。気持会は、次世代の高齢者とその介護者の皆さんを支援し、また擁護するために尽力いたします。

気持会では過去50年にわたり、高齢者が尊厳と自立を保ちながら生活し、高齢者が施設に入る必要がある状態になるまでの段階を出来るだけ遅延したり、回避したりするために役立つサービスを提供してきました。このようなサービスの中には、食事プログラム、送迎サービス、ソーシャルサービス(社会福祉)、在宅介護の紹介、デイケアプログラム、及び高齢者向けケア付き住宅の運営が含まれます。

これらのサービスを維持し、新しい世代が気持会の助けを必要とするときに気持会が新しい時代に見合うサービスを提供するため、気持会は、「気持会Dedication Wall」の構築にあたり、皆様からのご協力をお願い致します。私たちの目標である、2022年9月1日までに、個人及び企業からの寄付金\$500,000ドルを調達し、これらの寄付金の全てを、シニアプログラムと介護者支援の向上に運用致します。

Kimochi Over 50 Years

- 1971**  Steve Nakajo, Sandy Mori and a group of devoted Sansei envision the beginnings of Kimochi to support the elderly Issei. In July 1971, Kimochi, Inc. becomes a 501©3 non-profit, community-based organization.
- 1972** Kimochi submits a grant to the California Department on Aging and is awarded a research and demonstration project for social services.
- 1974**  Kimochi launches a Japanese hot meals program for seniors through a grant awarded by the California Department on Aging. Today, Kimochi provides 133,000 meals annually.
- 1976**  Kimochi, Inc. begins the Transportation Program for seniors from a grant submission through California's Urban and Mass Transit Act.
- 1979** With funding awarded by the San Francisco Commission on the Aging, Kimochi expands the nutrition program to 365-days a year.
- 1983**  Kimochi Home opens its doors at 1531 Sutter Street, San Francisco as residential and respite care center for 20 seniors -- with capacity for 40 seniors to participate in adult day social activities.
- 1986** Kimochi moves its offices and weekday programs to the Japanese Community & Cultural Center of Northern California (JCCNC) to house Administration, Nutrition, Transportation, Social Services, and the Senior Center.
- 1992**  Kimochi completes Kimochi Lounge renovation in the Kinokuniya Mall to provide a safe and welcoming gathering place for seniors to read and relax, get the latest news in the community and socialize.
- 1998-99**  Kimochi purchases a 1715 Buchanan Street property and launches a capital campaign to undertake building renovations to house expanding operations. Building renovation is completed in 1999 and this location continues to serve as Kimochi's home base.
- 2006**  Kimochi is awarded a contract from the San Francisco Office on the Aging to provide case management to seniors from the Japanese and Korean communities.
- 2008** To help seniors live safely and independently at home, Kimochi develops a Home Safety program providing seniors home safety assessments and assistance in identifying reputable vendors who can assist with home repairs.
- 2009**  Kimochi begins Club Nikkei to promote Active Aging. Club Nikkei is a membership-based social and recreational program for Nikkei seniors to enjoy group outings and excursions.

2009 To extend care services into the Peninsula, Kimochi submits a grant and is awarded funding from San Mateo County Aging and Adult Services to provide Family Caregiver Support Services in the county.

2015 Establishing roots in the Peninsula, Kimochi breaks ground at 453 N. San Mateo Drive, San Mateo, CA. Renovations to Kimochi San Mateo begin.



2015 Kimochi Home seniors are honored by a visit from Japan's Prime Minister, Shinzo Abe's wife, Lady Akie Abe, who visits Kimochi Home, one of three stops on an official trip to San Francisco.

2016 Kimochi San Mateo receives licensing approval to open as a non-ambulatory Residential Care Facility for the elderly. With licensing approval from the San Mateo County Planning Department, residents make Kimochi San Mateo their new home.



2016 Kimochi, Inc. co-founder Steve Nakajo, retires from Kimochi after 45 years of service. Steve Ishii, Associate Director, is named Executive Director by the Board of Directors.



2017 Kimochi San Mateo expands services by starting a home-delivered meals program to seniors in San Mateo County.



2018 Kimochi's Director of Programs, Anna Sawamura-Higaki resigns after 35 years of Kimochi service. Kimochi proudly announces Shawne O'Connell as Kimochi's new Director of Programs.



2020 In early response to COVID, Kimochi takes fast action to enact strict policies on Kimochi Home and Kimochi San Mateo visitation – ahead of the mandatory “no visitation” order from the Department of Social Services. Transportation and Social Services programs are quickly modified, and the Nutrition Program is immediately converted to a ‘take-out’ system only. Home-delivered meals continue. To-date, Kimochi seniors have been kept safe.



2021 Kimochi proudly marks a huge milestone -- 50 years of care and advocacy for seniors and their caregivers, of all ethnicities. We remain committed to serving future generations of seniors.



Kimochi Programs and Services

Please call to inquire as some programs/services modified due to COVID

Community Services (San Francisco)

Kimochi staff plan a variety of monthly activities, such as Tai Chi and Origami & Chat, for independent and active seniors to stay healthy - mind and body.

Intergenerational CARE Program (San Francisco)

The CARE Program is a new program that Kimochi, Inc. and JCYC (Japanese Community Youth Council) are undertaking in partnership with the City of San Francisco. The aim of the program is to foster an exchange between generations by hosting inter-generational activities.

Family Caregiver Support Program (San Francisco and San Mateo)

The pandemic presents a new set of challenges for friends and family caring for an elderly loved one. You are not alone. Kimochi offers various support programs and educational seminars for caregivers to help you through these difficult times.

Community Dining Program (San Francisco)

A nutritious, well-balanced, Japanese-style hot lunch is provided 5 days a week, Monday through Friday (except major holidays), from 11:00am – 1:00pm. Onsite, sit-down dining at Kimochi Senior Center is currently closed. Lunch is available for take-away only.

Home-Delivered Meals (San Francisco)

Seniors who are unable to shop for or prepare their own meals may qualify for our Home Delivered Meals Program. A hot, nutritious Japanese-style lunch is delivered Monday through Friday, plus frozen meals for the weekend. For the health and safety of staff and clients, Kimochi has instituted a no-contact delivery method.

Case Management (San Francisco)

Kimochi's Case Management Program helps seniors in San Francisco who are at risk for early institutionalization to coordinate all the services that they may need in order to live safely in their home. Social workers are available via telephone or email consultation.

Kimochi Home and Kimochi San Mateo Facilities

We are happy to announce that there is good news and updates regarding visiting residents at our facilities. Visitation has been expanded and now includes:

- Indoor visitations
- Hugging, hand holding, brief physical contact are allowed IF both visitor and resident are fully COVID vaccinated + 2 weeks.
- Outdoor & Virtual visits continue to be offered as safer alternatives.
- All visits must be scheduled in advance. Visitors must submit to COVID screening & temperature checks before visitation.

Outings are allowed and now include

- Holiday celebrations
- Private gatherings
- Extended or Overnight stays

New residents or residents returning from outings, do not need to quarantine if they:

- Are fully vaccinated
- Safely follow COVID protocols
- Have not gathered with more than three households

Facial coverings and physical distancing:

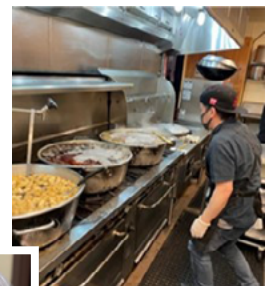
- Continues to be followed and enforced both indoors and outdoors.

コミュニティサービス(サンフランシスコ)

気持会スタッフは、太極拳や折り紙と談話など、自立したアクティブな高齢者が心と体の健康を維持するためのさまざまな月次活動を計画しています。

世代間ケアプログラム(サンフランシスコ)

CAREプログラムは、Kimochi Inc.とJCYC (Japanese Community Youth Council) がサンフランシスコ市と提携して行っている新しいプログラムです。このプログラムの目的は、世代間の活動を主催することにより、世代間の交流を促進することです。

家族介護者支援プログラム(サンフランシスコとサンマテオ)

パンデミックは、高齢者の世話をしている家族や友人に、新たな課題をもたらした。あなたは一人ではありません。気持会では、このような困難な時期を乗り切るために、介護者向けに様々な支援プログラムや教育セミナーを提供しています。

コミュニティダイニングプログラム(サンフランシスコ)

月曜日から金曜日(主要な祝日を除く)までの週5日、午前11時から午後1時まで、栄養価の高いバランスの取れた温かい和食ランチを提供しています。現在気持シニアセンターでのオンサイトダイニング(着席式の会食)は休業中です。ランチはテイクアウトのみ可能です。

食事宅配(サンフランシスコ)

自分で食事を購入したり準備したりできない高齢者は、気持会の宅配食プログラムを受けることが出来る場合があります。(※要査定)月曜日から金曜日まで、栄養価の高い温かい日本食のランチと、週末に召し上がって頂く冷凍した食事をお届けします。(※要査定)スタッフとクライアントの健康と安全を守るために、気持会では非接触配送方式を導入しました。



ケース マネジメント(サンフランシスコ)

気持会のケースマネジメントプログラムは、ケアホーム等への早期収容のリスクがあるサンフランシスコ在住の高齢者が、自宅で安全に暮らすために必要な全てのサービスを受けられるようにコーディネートをするお手伝いをしています。ソーシャルワーカーへのご相談は、電話または電子メールで受け付けています

気持ホームと気持サンマテオ;高齢者介護施設

気持ホーム、気持サンマテオ両介護施設の居住者を訪問する際の規制が緩和されたことをお知らせ出来ることを嬉しく思います。

訪問する際の規制が緩和されました。以下の事項が含まれます。

- ・ 屋内の訪問
- ・ 訪問者と居住者の両者が完全にCOVIDのワクチン接種を完了している場合(最後のワクチン接種から2週間が経過していること)は、ハグ、手を握りあうなど、短時間の身体的接触を許可
- ・ より安全な代替手段として、屋外での訪問、及びバーチャルビジット(オンラインによる)は継続
- ・ 全ての訪問に関して、必ず事前予約を取ることを、又訪問者は、入館前に検温とCOVIDに関する問診表に記入すること

居住者の外出許可に関して以下参照

- ・ ホリデーを祝うための外出
- ・ 個人的な集まりへの参加
- ・ 外泊、長期の外泊

新規居住者又は、外出先から戻って来た居住者は、以下の条件を満たしている場合、隔離をする必要はありません。

- ・ ワクチン接種を完了している場合
- ・ COVID に関する安全手順(プロトコル)に従っていること
- ・ 3世帯以上で集まらない事

マスク等の着用と既定の間隔を保つこと

- ・ 屋内外の両方でマスク等の着用とソーシャルディスタンスを引き続き守って行動する事

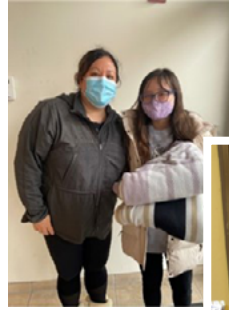
E-WASTE RECYCLING

From as little as one hour per month to a few hours a day, your volunteer support makes a huge difference.

Nutrition Services

(Volunteers are needed Monday-Friday year round, between the hours of 9:00AM to 2:00PM.)

Food Preparation: Assist in preparation of meals.

Weekday Lunch Program: On-site assistance in serving meals, bussing and resetting of dining room.

Home Delivered Meals: Delivery of meals to home-bound seniors.

Kimochi Home San Francisco and Kimochi San Mateo

(Volunteers are needed Monday-Friday year round, between the hours of 9:00AM to 5:00PM.) Kimochi Home San Francisco needs tend to be Monday-Friday; weekends for Kimochi San Mateo.

Escorting: Escort and assist seniors with daily walks, outings or appointments.

The Administrative building is owned and operated by the agency and houses the administrative staff and the volunteer program.

Residential Care (License #415600974)

Kimochi San Mateo is licensed by the State of California to provide 24 hour supervised non-medical care to ambulatory and non-ambulatory seniors. We have the capacity to house 14 seniors in either single or shared rooms. Each room has a private bathroom. Please call for more information on how to apply for a stay with us.

Home Delivered Meals Program

Japanese and Asian style hot lunches are prepared and delivered Monday through Friday for seniors living at home. Meals are for those who are homebound and unable to prepare meals on their own. This is a donation based program and deliveries are scheduled based on need and geographic proximity to the Kimochi San Mateo site.

Family Caregiver Support Program

Family members and friends are often providing caregiving support to their spouses, parents and to seniors in the community. This program offers information, outreach and supportive services to strengthen a caregiver's capacity to help keep seniors at home. We schedule presentations, home visits, support groups, and provide information and referrals to help address the unique needs of each family who contacts us.

Weekday Lunch Program

A nutritious well-balanced Japanese style hot lunch is provided five days a week. Any senior 60 years of age or older is welcome. A five week menu is produced by staff, and our nutritionist ensures each meal is healthy, nutritionally well-balanced and adequately proportioned for seniors. An average of 300 meals is served daily. During the pandemic, over 500 meals are currently served daily.

The program annually serves 1,200 seniors 75,000 lunches.

Home Delivery Program

Seniors who are physically unable to travel to the senior center due to a disability or illness, can receive our Japanese style hot lunches at home. Each recipient is required to complete an eligibility assessment on a quarterly basis.

The program annually serves 130 homebound and frail seniors 29,000 lunches.

Senior Center

In addition to enjoying lunch at the nutrition program, seniors are encouraged to participate in activities at The Center. Staff and volunteers plan and offer a variety of activities on a monthly basis. We have morning exercise classes, a ceramics class, group singing classes, odori, bingo, arts and crafts, day trips, and overnight trips.

The program annually serves 300 seniors and offers 700 hours of exciting activities.

Transportation

Safe and reliable door-to-door transportation services are provided to help seniors maintain a connection with their community and friends. Transportation can also be requested for medical trips and grocery shopping.

The program annually assists 150 seniors with 10,000 rides.
